I have a keen interest in dementia research, with a specific focus on the in-the-moment impact of children and animals in enhancing social connections for people living with dementia. As a nurse lecturer, I teach person-centred approaches to care and have incorporated Dawn Brooker's VIPS person-centred framework into my teaching and research. I also believe that I bring methodological experience to INTERDEM.

I am an experienced qualitative researcher and have published methodological papers on, qualitative case study methodology, qualitative evidence synthesis methodology, data collection, ethics, rigour, paradigms and analysis in qualitative research. I am Co-Chair for QUESTS (Qualitative Research in Trials Centre), established in 2016 and embedded within HRB-trials Methodology Research Network. I am also co-lead for the Qualitative Research in Trials (QRiT) target group, within the MRC-NIHR Trials Methodology Research Partnership (TMRP). I was also PI on a project looking at qualitative data sharing practices in clinical trials in the UK and Ireland (https://hrbopenresearch.org/articles/6-10/v1).

I have extensive experience in qualitative evidence synthesis and was recently appointed coconvenor for the Cochrane Qualitative and Implementation Methods group and is involved in the new Cochrane-Campbell Handbook for Qualitative Evidence Synthesis (2023). I am a research associate for Evidence Synthesis Ireland, and a member of the Emergency Evidence Response Service (EERS) in response to COVID-19.

In addition to her publications, I have delivered numerous workshops, webinars, podcasts, developed infographics and written evidence summaries and plain language summaries demonstrating an understanding of the importance of impact beyond publication.
