I currently work as Professor of Dementia Care at the Geller Institute of Ageing and Memory, University of West London. My research experience builds upon my clinical expertise and I have worked as a nurse researcher for the past 20 years and am experienced in mixed methods research and clinical trials management. My current research interests focus on evaluating psychosocial interventions to improve care and quality of life for people with dementia and their family caregivers, this includes interventions for risk enablement, crisis management, managing agitation, facilitating early diagnosis in dementia and strategies to support family caregivers. I am also involved in the teaching and supervision of undergraduate and postgraduate students.

- Chief Investigator on RAISe-Dementia (Risk Assessment and Increasing Safety in Dementia) study. A 3-year Dunhill Medical Trust grant funded study to examine the validity, feasibility and acceptability of a risk assessment tool for people with dementia living at home.
- Co-applicant on NIDUS (New interventions for Independence in Dementia) study led by Dr Claudia Cooper at UCL. A 5-year Alzheimer's Society grant funded study that aims to enable people with dementia to live a quality life at home through supporting them and their family carers, directly and through improving home care services.
