#### **PROFILE OF MEMBER:**

Evelyn Finnema has nearly twenty years of experience in health care research, mostly in elderly care, but also in the care for mentally disabled and mental health care. In 2000, Evelyn Finnema wrote a PhD thesis at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam about the effect of integrated emotion-oriented care versus usual care on elderly persons with dementia in the nursing home and on nursing assistants; a randomized clinical trial. Since 2008 Evelyn Finnema works as a professor in elderly care with a research group of six persons. First at Rotterdam University of Applied sciences and since 2010 at the NHL University of Applied sciences Leeuwarden. The research themes are: living, wellbeing and care for frail elderly and people with dementia and the role of the care professionals taking care of them. She is member of the advisory board of the Dutch project DementiaAndThen (www.dementieendan.nl). A project resulting in a television documentary about developments in research, care and quality of life of people with dementia. Evelyn is also a member of the Committee of Recommendation of the "Odense Groningen House", for people with dementia and their informal carers. Besides her work as a professor she is a member of the Supervisory Board of Cosis, an organization providing care and support to people with intellectual disabilities and mental health care and she is a member of the advisory board of the Dutch Institute on quality of care.

#### **AREAS OF EXPERTISE:**

Scientific research / applied scientific research in the field of health care in particular elderly care with a focus on professional care for frail elderly and persons with dementia.

But also management expertise due to diverse management functions in large care organisations (for example director of a mental health organization, head of the medical department of an organization for mentally disabled, head of research and development and quality control of a large home care organization).
