PROFILE OF MEMBER:

I am a health scientist and epidemiologist and currently working as a senior researcher at VUmc-EMGO. My PhD thesis (obtained in 2012) focussed on depression and anxiety in family caregivers of persons with dementia. A large part of this work involved the evaluation of the (cost-) effectiveness of a family meetings intervention for family caregivers of persons with dementia on the prevention of depression and anxiety. After finishing my thesis, I combined my research work with policy work at the VUmc Alzheimer Centre where I was involved in the development of the Dutch national strategy for dementia "Deltaplan Dementia". I am currently involved in several research projects with a focus on dementia care in community and nursing home settings, informal care, resilience, and evaluation of quality and cost of dementia care (see current research interests/ongoing projects).

AREAS OF EXPERTISE:

Main expertise in quantitative data-analyses. Experience with evaluating the effectiveness and costeffectiveness of complex interventions, and conducting observational research to analyse prevalence, incidence, risk profiles and diagnostic accuracy. Research involves primary care and long term care settings, mainly focussed on persons with dementia and their informal caregivers.
