PROFILE OF MEMBER: Ana Rita Ferreira is a Portuguese clinical psychologist combining expertise in clinical practice, psychogerontology, psychosocial gerontology, neuropsychology, methodology and health services research. She holds a PhD in Clinical and Health Services Research (2022, Faculty of Medicine, University of Porto), a Master's in Clinical and Health Psychology with specialization in Clinical Psychogerontology (2009, University of Coimbra), and is a board-certified Specialist in Clinical and Health Psychology and in Neuropsychology by the Portuguese Psychologists Association (OPP). Since 2009, Ana Rita has been engaged in research on ageing, dementia, and mental health, contributing to projects on the adaptation and validation of assessment instruments, evaluation of neuropsychiatric symptoms, unmet needs, and quality of care in older adults, both in community and institutional settings. She has also collaborated on studies addressing post-COVID-19 mental health in critical care survivors, highlighting her versatility. Ana Ritas's scientific output includes co-editing one book, co-authoring five book chapters, and publishing more than 70 indexed works, including 24 full-text articles. Her publications span the fields of ageing, dementia care, psychiatry and mental health, technology adoption, health services research and more recently young onset dementia. She has contributed to the development of validated tools and practical resources in her main expertise fields, such as the Portuguese versions of the Neuropsychiatric Inventory (NPI) [FERREIRA AR, Martins S, Ribeiro O, Fernandes L. Validity and reliability of the European Portuguese version of Neuropsychiatric Inventory in an institutionalized sample. Journal of Clinical Medicine Research, 2015; 7(1):21-28. doi: 10.14740/jocmr1959w] and Abe's BPSD Score [FERREIRA AR, Sá A, Dias CC, Simões MR, Abe K, Fernandes L. Ana Rita has a record of international collaboration with INTERDEM and several of its members, more specifically through the Assistive Technology Taskforce during the COVID-19 pandemic under the UTeC19 Subgroup project – Uptake of technology among people with dementia during the COVID-19 pandemic [Barbosa A, FERREIRA AR, Smits C, Sezgin D, Casey D, Hegerath FM, Volmar H, Øksnebjerg L, Fernandes L, Hopper L, Craven M, in collaboration with INTERDEM AT Taskforce. Clinically, Ana Rita has worked across primary care, the National Network for Integrated Continuous Care (RNCCI), and social care services (nursing homes, day care centres, home care services), applying neuropsychological assessment, intervention, and needs analysis. This grounding in practice enriches her applied research and informs her focus on improving care models through intersectoral collaboration between healthcare, social care, and community services.

In academia, Ana Rita is an Assistant Professor at the Faculty of Medicine, University of Porto, where she teaches on ageing, mental health, psychological assessment, and geriatric psychopathology at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. She has supervised or co-supervised 30 master's dissertations and one PhD thesis and is currently supervising or co-supervising four PhD and nine master's dissertations in areas such as neurosciences, gerontology and geriatrics, non-pharmacological interventions in dementia, psychology, psychiatry and mental health. She also contributes to postgraduate education for health and social care professionals, supporting workforce capacity-building in dementia and ageing care, particularly in unmet needs assessment, cognitive screening and neuropsychological assessment. Ana Rita's profile reflects a translational research approach that integrates clinical practice, research, and teaching, with a consistent focus on people with dementia, their needs, and the quality of care.
